The design concept

The proposed Dubbo Residential Rehabilitation Centre is being designed by Fulton Trotter Architects. The current plans reflect an understanding of:

- Connecting with Country design principles;
- · Therapeutic design requirements;
- Local urban design and landscape principles; and
- Feedback from our first round of community consultation sessions.

At the March consultation events we received a wide range of views and opinions regarding the proposed Centre and the initial design addresses many of the issues raised. We recognise there may still be areas of concern for some residents, and we are committed to working through those concerns with you to address them as best we can.

How you can get involved

We are committed to working with the community and stakeholders to ensure the clinical, environmental and community needs are met in the design of the Centre, and ensure the best possible outcomes are achieved.

To help you understand the design process and principles for the Dubbo Residential Rehabilitation Centre, we will be hosting a pop-up design exhibition and guided community site walks on Thursday 20 June and Friday 21 June 2024.

At this event we will show computer-generated images and architectural plans of the proposed Residential Rehabilitation Centre. Fulton Trotter Architects and Western NSW LHD representatives will explain the architectural plans and answer your questions.

JOIN A GUIDED COMMUNITY SITE WALK Friday 21 June 2024

On Friday 21 June 2024, we will run five guided site walks. This event will be held on the site of the proposed **Dubbo**Residential Rehabilitation Centre at Lot 311 and Lot 312,

Spears Drive. The walks will be one hour in duration and will be held throughout the day at the following times:

At this event Fulton Trotter Architects will explain the concept design for the Centre. We will walk around the site and use computer-generated images and architectural plans to show you how the Centre will appear on the site and fit into the neighbourhood. You will have the opportunity to talk directly to our project architect and project team. Mobility-impaired people can participate in this event from the comfort of an on-site marquee.

Each walk will commence at the marquee at the Spears Drive frontage of the site. You do not need to register prior to attending a walk, however we ask that you arrive 15 minutes before the scheduled start time to register on the day. We will provide a barbeque and light refreshments throughout the day. We invite you to chat with the project team after your walk.

For safety reasons all participants must wear enclosed shoes. This is an outside event, so please dress appropriately and if the weather forecast is uncertain, bring an umbrella. The event will be cancelled in inclement weather.

To minimise any disruption to neighbours we encourage you to carpool to the event if you live or work outside the area or walk if you live in the neighbourhood.
